


HORSHAM ARUN BADMINTON CLUB

We would like to remind everyone that **shuttles form a large proportion of the club's costs**.

Please be mindful of how many you use. If the current rate of use continues then we may have to increase membership fees again next year.

At sessions where there are more than double the number of players off the court than on court, please play games to 15.

(25+ for 3 courts, 17+ for 2 courts)

TOURNAMENT SUCCESSES

Some more silverware and successes for HABC players in the last quarter, and also a telling theme when medals weren't won – see if you can spot it!

Sussex Championships (September 2024)

Issy Noakes, **Brannon Lee Chong** and **David Jolliffe** all took part in the county championships at the start of the season.

In the Men's Doubles, **David** and **Brannon** secured a commendable 3rd place, with a comeback 19-21 21-11 24-22 win against Peter Cox and Christopher Morgan, before losing out to eventual winners Dean George and David King.

In the Women's Doubles, **Issy**, playing with sister Bea, also secured a 3rd place finish with a comeback 21-23 21-15 21-14 win before losing out to the eventual winners Amber Robers and Hannah Seagraves. In the mixed doubles, **Brannon** and **Issy** played out 3 group games in what can only be described as a group of death.

Kent Tier 4 (Saturday 16th November)

Issy Noakes, **Brannon Lee Chong** and **David Jolliffe** again took a short hop over the border into Kent to play in their latest Tier 4.

In the Men's Singles, **Brannon** played some great singles before losing out in the Quarter Final to the eventual winner.

In the Men's Doubles, **David** and **Brannon** played out some rather tight matches (including David's first ever 30-29 game!) to reach the quarter finals before finally running out of steam and losing to the eventual winners.

In the Women's Singles, **Issy** upgraded her silver medal from August, with a comeback 19-21 21-16 21-11 win to secure the title!

Sussex Tier 4 (Sunday 24th November)

An army of Horsham players made the trip down to Worthing with Issy Noakes, Brannon Lee Chong and David Jolliffe being joined by Helen James and Vithuran Krishnamoorthy for this one.

In the Men's Singles, **Vithuran** won 2 matches but lost out to an eventual semi-finalist. Meanwhile **Brannon** battled through 2 tight 3-setters in the group stage before mounting a charge in the knockouts that led him all the way to his first gold medal!

This charge meant that it was many back-2-back games in the Men's Doubles for **David** and **Brannon** who wasted in winning their group games 21-10 21-7, 21-9 21-10, and 21-13 21-3. However, they then lost out to Peter Cox and Christopher Morgan having beaten them only 2 months earlier.

In the Mixed Doubles, **David** and **Helen** secured a great win before losing out to one of the eventual finalists in what turned out to be a battle of Warwick Badminton Alumni.

Meanwhile, in the women's singles there was the biggest group stage draw anyone had ever seen, with **Issy** having to play 5 best of 3 set matches. Unfortunately, she just lost out to Jane Ashfold but still came home with a silver medal to back up the gold from the week before.

English Masters Championships (November-December 2024)

A full rundown of the Master tournaments in the buildup to this event can be found on the Badminton England Website, but they were just the prelim for the main event in Hatfield.

In the Over 75s, **Mike Stoneman** lost out in both the Men's and Mixed Doubles. But it was still an impressive feat to just be there having suffered with injury for a while.

In the Over 60s, **Karen Thomas** topped her mixed group before losing out in the Semi Finals. But in the Women's Doubles she breezed through the group stage, before 2 comeback wins in the knockouts to win the National Title!

In the Over 65s, **John Molyneux** lost out in the group stage of the Mixed Doubles. But, in the Men's Doubles, he lived up to his billing as number 1 seed and raced all the way to the National Title without dropping a set!
